### 1. WHĀINGA (PURPOSE)

- 1.1 The purpose of this paper is to present Te Here with a six-monthly update report which provides an overview of the following:
- Ngāi Tahu Fund
  - Marae Development Fund
    - Pūtea Whakarahi
    - Pūtea Aumakea
  - Mahinga Kai Enhancement Fund
  - Taurahere Fund
  - Fundraising – support and advice
  - Outcomes, general targets, issues and future areas of focus.

### 2. NGĀ KAUPAPA MATUA (POINTS OF INFORMATION):

#### 2.1 Ngāi Tahu Fund

- To date 2 funding rounds were held in FY18/19. 142 applicants applied to the fund seeking a total of \$2,032,798. The total amount allocated in FY18/19 was \$998,352 with 113 applications approved.
- There has been a noticeable increase in the number of applications to the fund and therefore amounts funded have been less than requested to ensure a greater number of projects are supported.

#### 2.2 Marae Development Fund

- In FY18/19 \$1,390,384 was sought from the Marae Development Fund from 8 Papatipu Rūnanga for a variety of capital works projects. 7 applications were approved to the total of \$790,384, 5 Tier One projects and 3 Tier Two projects.
- 17 10-year Capital Works Plans have been received from Papatipu Rūnanga.

#### A. Pūtea Whakarahi (Tier Two)

##### Funding Criteria

An application received for Pūtea Whakarahi funding was declined as the project was not on the marae complex.

This highlighted that the criteria for marae development restricting capital works projects to the marae complex also restricts rūnanga from utilising this fund across their property portfolios.

## **B. Pūtea Aumakea**

To date, 4 papatipu marae have had solar panels installed at Kokourarata, Ngāti Waewae, Ōnuku and Tūāhuriri.

Post the Canterbury and Christchurch earthquakes the 6 Papatipu Rūnanga in the region were supported to install generators. From this fund, generator installations have been completed at Ngāti Waewae, Ōtākou and Moeraki, with a total of 8 marae installations still to be completed. Due to fluctuations in the exchange rate for imported components there has been a price increase of 9-11% since original estimates were received.

### **Energy Audit**

Beacon Pathway have been engaged to complete Energy Audits/Resilience Scoping for all marae prior to installation of solar panels and to the end of the financial year, to date 14 marae have been assessed.

The cost of scoping along with increased generator costs, will impact on the budget allocated to Pūtea Aumakea.

## **2.3 Mahinga Kai Enhancement Fund**

- i) Applications received in the March round are allocated funding from 1 July 2019. 3 new applications were received and approved funding, with 2 additional projects having been approved for multiyear funding. In total 5 applications were approved funding of \$198,738 in FY19/20.
  - a) Te Rūnanga o Ōtākou - Mahinga Kai Opportunities at Te Kōhaka o Tukiauau
  - b) Te Rūnanga o Kaikōura - Customary Kina Monitoring - Stage 2
  - c) Te Kōhaka o Tūhaitara Trust - Tūhaitara Trust Coastal Park Restoration
  - d) Oraka Aparima - Management of Tītī (Beneficial) Islands
  - e) Bluff Hill Motupōhue Environment Trust - Te Korowai Whakahou Native Plant Nursery

## **2.4 Taurahere Fund**

- i) In FY18/19, 6 Taurahere groups accessed the operational/administrative fund:
  - a) Ngāi Tahu ki Otaki Horowhenua Kapiti - \$2,000
  - b) Ngāi Tahu Iwi I Poihakena (Sydney) - \$2,000
  - c) Ngāi Tahu ki Whakatāne - \$2,000
  - d) Ngāi Tahu ki Whanganui-a-tara - \$2,000
  - e) Ngāi Tahu ki Tāmaki Makaurau - \$2,000
  - f) Ngāi Tahu ki Victoria - \$2,000
- ii) The Taurahere Policies and Procedures Review has been completed, resulting in an annual funding increase to \$5,000 from 1 July 2019 for active Taurahere groups.

## **2.5 External Funding**

- i) \$505,000 of external funding has been secured via direct fundraising advice to support Papatipu Rūnanga initiatives in the last 6 months.
- ii) Funds sourced to date have been from the following entities;
  - a) Department of Internal Affairs
  - b) Te Puni Kōkiri Te Mahi Korowai
  - c) Ministry of Youth Development
  - d) Rata Foundation
  - e) Te Putahitanga
  - f) Tuia Fund

### 3. **TE MAHERE MAHI (FURTHER WORK PLANNED):**

3.1 Ngāi Tahu Funds and Oranga have been working over the past 6 to 12 months to transition Kā Ararau ki Aoraki and Manawa Hou kaupapa to the Ngāi Tahu Funds work programme. We have recently appointed a staff member to co-ordinate the administration of the funding for these initiatives out to the iwi through a contestable process.

3.2 The Governance of these programmes has not been transferred and will still be led by Te Here and Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu, not the Ngāi Tahu Funds Committee.

3.3 The RUIA collaborative funding initiative initially led by Ngāi Tahu for Rangatahi across Te Wai Pounamu will continue to take shape as we work toward finalising a Memorandum of Understanding with all parties and agreement on criteria and process for Te Putahitanga to administer the new funds.

#### 3.4 **Pūtea Aumakea**

Ngāi Tahu Funds staff are keen to explore further opportunities for supporting resilience and sustainability on Ngāi Tahu Marae.

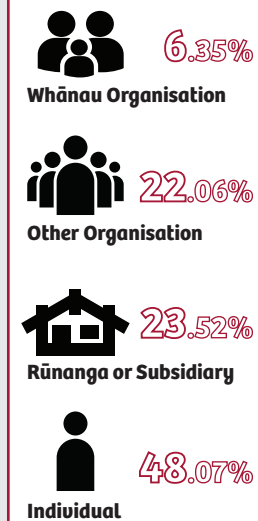

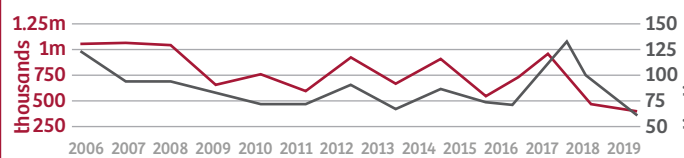

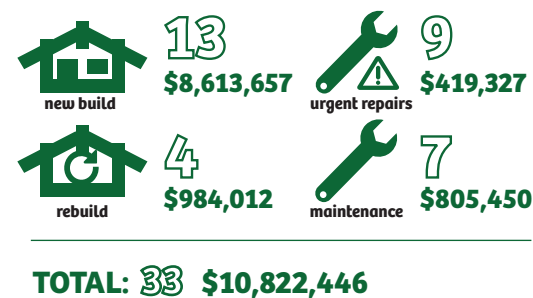
Tiers 1 and 2



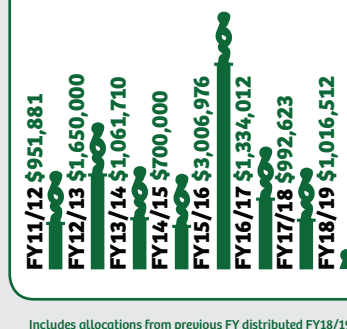

## TYPES of applications\*



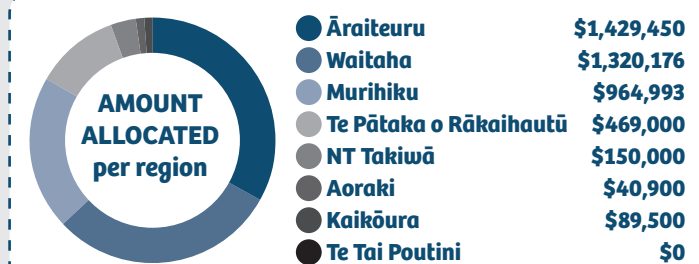
## TOTAL DISTRIBUTED to date\*

## SPECIES + PLACES SUPPORTED



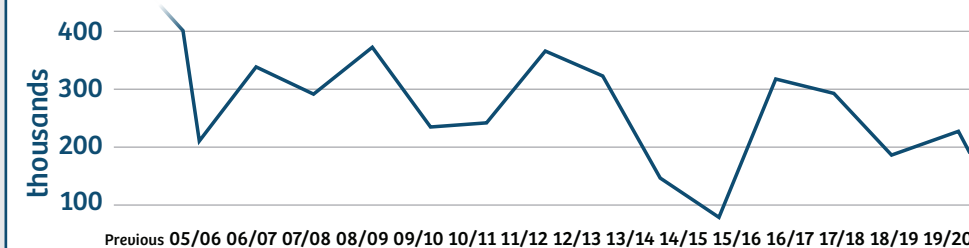

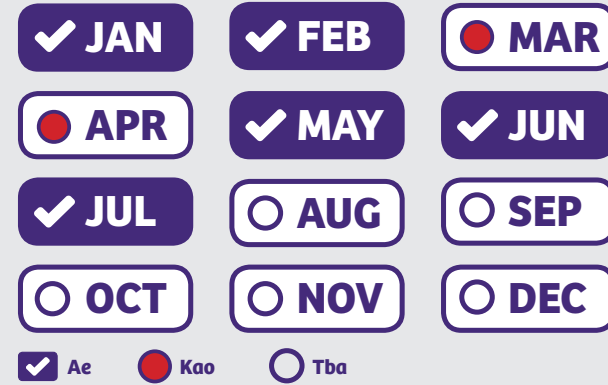

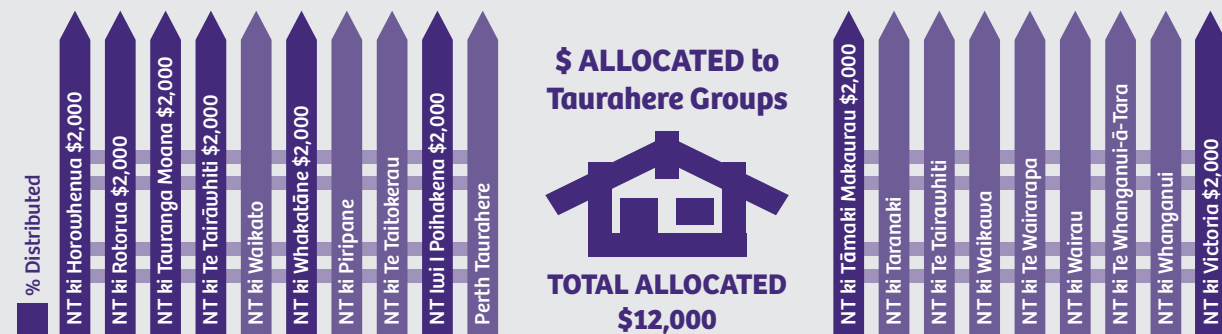

## HE TINO HUA – highlights

Profile of a project supported by Ngāi Tahu Funds Staff

In late 2017, the Ngāi Tahu Fund proudly contributed \$80,000 towards the creation of two pou whenua led by the Whakaraupō Carving Centre, Ngāi Tahu Kaiwhakairo, Caine Tauwhare with support from Te Hapū o Ngāti Wheke. Recently, the first pou, Te Hamo o Tū Te Rakiwhānoa was unveiled and blessed on Ōtamahua (Quail Island). The pou, which are made from Red Heart Tōtara, are cultural markers, and help to share the histories and stories of Ngāi Tahu in and around Whakaraupō. The second pou is currently being carved and is to be erected on Ōhinetahi (dates yet to be confirmed).

## NGĀ TAKE – Issues

Looking forward – any warnings of issues on the horizon:

### Ngāi Tahu Fund

- There has been a noticeable increase in the number of applications to the fund and therefore amounts funded have been less than requested to ensure a greater pool of projects are supported and we believe it is necessary to increase the funding budget for the Ngāi Tahu Fund.
- Successful applications to the Ngāi Tahu Fund from Taurahere rūpū and whānau in Australia, have budgeted their projects based on Australian dollars, however due to the exchange rate and bank fees, the reduced payment can negatively impact the project.

## MARAE DEVELOPMENT FUND

### Putea Aumakea

Beacon Pathway were engaged to design and undertake Resilience/Sustainability Scoping on each of the marae and 14 site assessments have been completed to date.

### Generators

- Three rūnanga have had the generators installed. There have been increased costs as a result the exchange rate and delays in importation of equipment.

### Solar

- Installations have been completed at four rūnanga and the next phase of installation should occur following the next Ngāi Tahu Funds Committee hui.

### Taurahere Fund

- Six Taurahere rūpū accessed funding in FY18/19 and the Ngāi Tahu Funds Committee completed the review of the Policies and Procedures for this fund.

### Putea Whakarahi (Teir Two)

#### Funding Criteria

- The criteria for marae development limits capital works projects to the marae complex which restricts rūnanga from utilizing this fund for their property portfolios.
