1. TE WHĀINGA (PURPOSE):

- 1.1 The purpose of this paper is to inform Te Here about the transition of Aoraki Bound, Kā Ararau ki Aoraki and Manawa Hou from the Oranga - Development and Capability team to Ngāi Tahu Funds.

2. HE KUPU WHAKATAKI (BACKGROUND/INTRODUCTION):

- 2.1 Annually Aoraki Bound has delivered two wānanga a year for \$200,000 excluding the co-ordination and administration by the Office of Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu. The programme has delivered cultural and personal development outcomes for Ngāi Tahu whānau and the general public. In delivering opportunities to the public, it is unique in this sense in comparison to all other iwi capability development initiatives that Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu (Te Rūnanga) delivers.
- 2.2 Aoraki Bound has been through several internal and external reviews to assist with the ongoing administration of the programme and to better understand the cost-benefit of the initiative for tribal members. The most recent of these was the 2017 review that took a deep dive into the first 10 years of Aoraki Bound and provided potential developments for future.
- 2.3 A key point noted in the Aoraki Bound review, and to be noted generally, is there is increased capability and capacity within the iwi to deliver culturally centred programmes as a result of other successful programmes delivered across Te Rūnanga.
- 2.4 A recent review of iwi capability delivery also took into consideration the implementation of the Manawa Hou wānanga. It was determined that these initiatives and related funds be made available to Papatipu Rūnanga and tribal members to deliver wānanga locally
- 2.5 Te Rūnanga is embarking on new initiatives aimed at broadening the reach of our programmes and initiatives to engage more iwi members. This is an opportunity for whānau, hapū and iwi to initiate, lead and implement new programmes to engage whānau with local tribal histories and Mātauranga Ngāi Tahu. Kā Ararau ki Aoraki has been developed to allow for shorter programmes of 3-7 days and through a contestable process 3 external Ngāi Tahu providers have been selected to offer Kā Ararau ki Aoraki for 2019-2021
- 2.6 Kā Ararau ki Aoraki is built on the success of Aoraki Bound and Manawa Hou, utilising the skills and knowledge gained and capitalising on the increased ability of whānau providers to deliver these new additional programmes. Combining this with the proven results of these programmes provides a template for additional whānau delivered kaupapa to learn from and should contribute to successful implementation.

- 2.7 Given the experience of Ngāi Tahu Funds in the administration of contestable funding for cultural activities and the alignment of the initiatives with the cultural pillars of the Ngāi Tahu Cultural Strategy it was agreed the Ngāi Tahu Funds staff would oversee this new approach.

3. NGĀ KAUPAPA MATUA (POINTS OF INFORMATION):

- 3.1 Under the administration of Ngāi Tahu Funds the Aoraki Bound programme will run in March 2020 and be reviewed with the expectation that Kā Ararau ki Aoraki and Manawa Hou will eventually replace Aoraki Bound. Both kaupapa will incorporate similar activities but be led by Ngāi Tahu whānau and delivered across 6 locations within the Ngāi Tahu takiwā. This will mean that participants will have the opportunity to participate in short 3-7-day activities.
- 3.2 From July 1st, 2019, Aoraki Bound wānanga, Manawa Hou, and Kā Ararau ki Aoraki funds will be administered by the Ngāi Tahu Funds staff to streamline cultural leadership activities.
- 3.3 The Governance of these programmes has not been transferred and will still be led by Te Here and Te Rūnanga, not the Ngāi Tahu Funds Committee.

4. NGĀ KAUPAPA MATAPAKINGA (POINTS FOR DISCUSSION):

- 4.1 The transition of these programmes to the Ngāi Tahu Funds staff has now been completed and 1 FTE has come from Oranga.

5. NGĀ HONONGA KI NGĀ POU E WHĀ (ALIGNMENT TO NGĀ POU E WHĀ)

- 5.1 Ngāi Tahu Cultural Pillars

6. TE MAHERE MAHI (FURTHER WORK PLANNED):

- 6.1 Aoraki Bound programme planning for March 2020 is underway and will be fully administered by Ngāi Tahu Funds staff.
- 6.2 Kā Ararau ki Aoraki, (3 programmes) and Manawa Hou (3 programmes) will commence in FY19/20 under the administration of Ngāi Tahu Funds staff.


